



Speaker: Rich Soltesz, K3SOM

Topic: Wolf River Coil Antenna System – Last Measurements

Including:

Continuing with our BVARA Presentation Series this year, our topic this month concludes our analysis of a very popular, portable-base vertical antenna called the *Wolf River Coil Antenna System (WRC)*.

In Part 1, we started with an examination of vertical and mobile antenna configurations that utilize a radiator that is less than a quarter wavelength high. These antennas typically use a loading coil to make the antenna appear to be electrically longer than its physical length. Based on the coil placed at the base or higher, we examined the effect on SWR, bandwidth, and on efficiency. We also looked at the 'textbook' effect of ground losses and loading coil losses on bandwidth and efficiency as well as how to conveniently measure the 'Q' for our WRC.

Part 2 was delayed by the weather, but some partial interesting results were presented. We investigated different types of ground configurations and materials that can reduce ground losses, thus improving power losses and efficiency of our antenna system. As a bonus, some of those materials save considerable time in both setup and breakdown time.

Our last measurements finished the actual results achieved for various ground configurations with both some expected and a few unexpected results. If you are thinking about doing some POTA operating, this is one exciting presentation that you won't want to miss. As a bonus, some excellent POTA and YouTube URLs will be included from AC3IE, Paul's recent ZOOM talk.

- 6. Your FRN Number. (free from the FCC, call for details)



ARRL Worked All States Award – A Little Help

Whether you're a new ham or not, contacting a ham in all 50 states can be a daunting task. Some states have plenty of hams on the air, while other, far less populated states have considerably fewer hams. Let's look at the populations of the top and bottom states, ranked by estimated 2024 population and the corresponding number of hams in that state:

ARRL's most popular award is the Worked All States Award. The WAS (Worked All States) Award is available to all amateurs worldwide who submit proof with written confirmation of contacts with each of the 50 states of the United States of America. Amateurs in the U.S. and possessions must be members of ARRL to apply for a WAS.

Contacts must be confirmed in writing, preferably in the form of QSL cards, or electronically via Logbook of the World (LoTW). Confirmations must show the applicant's call sign, band, mode, date and time, and indicate that the QSO was two-way.

Thousands upon thousands of awards have been issued to hams around the world. In ARRL's 101st year, the WAS certificates and the program award were redesigned in hopes of streamlining and improving the award program. The WAS program has many options which are listed at this ARRL web site along with more detailed information on qualifications and submittal requirements. These are called State QSO Parties and begin on Saturday and extend to Sunday on the specified starting dates listed below. 
