



These devices are significantly more affordable than the antenna analyzers that we looked at early last year. With a much wider frequency range and more precise calibration procedures, significant accuracy over the chosen frequency range can easily be obtained. At our January meeting we included:

- 6. Your FRN Number. (free from the FCC, call for details)





Yaesu VL-1000 Linear Amplifier and Matching VP-1000 Power Supply

Albert Belardia, WA3GFM, 86, passed away on Tuesday (September 27, 2022) at his home in Aliquippa, PA. Al was an active member in the *Beaver Valley Amateur Radio Association* and spent hours reaching out to amateur radio operators all over the globe. He made friends with contacts in over 320 Countries and on every Continent. With confirmed DXCC contacts on over 4-½ HF bands, Al was this close, to his goal of five-band D



For sale is his VL-1000 HF / 50 MHz Solid-State Linear Amplifier and VP-1000 matching Power Supply that operates on 120 to 230 VAC. The Linear Amplifier includes a built-in auto-sense tuner with 240 memories. Connecting to a non-Yaesu transceiver is also possible because the internal processor will measure the transceiver frequency and automatically switch to the appropriate band and auto tuner settings. The estate asked the BVARA to assist in finding suitable homes for his prized equipment.

AC power cord with a 20-Amp, 220 VAC twist-lock plug

DC cable that runs from the P/S to the amp

Data Band 1 cable (8-pin DIN <-> 8-pin DIN, 2 meter)

Data Band 2 cable (D-sub 15-pin <-> 1/8" miniature, 2 meter)

Connecting cables for non-Yaesu transceivers (ALC and Transmit cables are not included but are straight forward. All amplifier connectors are described in the 20-page User Manual)

Last year the unit was unboxed, connected to a suitable dummy load and powered up on all bands to verify its operability. The *attached photo* shows full output on the 10-meter band. Al, WA3GFM was the original and only owner of the equipment and was a non-smoker. He was meticulously proud of his equipment and always took excellent care of all of his ham radio equipment.

The club is asking \$2,400 for both units and would consider a reasonable offer. These units are in excellent condition and would be a welcome addition to your station. CLASS D – Listeners who copy only (log calls of participating stations you heard)

CQing: Send "CQ CWR CQ CWR"

Exchange: Signal report (including operating class) / QTH (your location) / Name

Example: You are a newer CW operator and you are in a QSO with K3XYZ whose signal

is readable, their signal strength is registering a '7' on your S-meter and their

signal tone is good. Your (example) callsign is W3ABC, you live in

Ambridge, and your name is Bruno. You would then send something like:

K3XYZ DE W3ABC (K3XYZ this is W3ABC) BT (break)

RST IS 579 B 579 B BT (signal report and class)

QTH IS AMBRIDGE, PA AMBRIDGE, PA BT

NAME IS BRUNO BRUNO BT

HW CPY? (how did you copy my transmission?)

K3XYZ DE W3ABC K (over)

The other station would then reply with their information using the same format. After the exchanges are completed, short informal remarks can be made during the QSO if desired, after which the contact would end with something like:

TNX FER QSO (thanks for the QSO)

GL ES 73 (good luck and best wishes)

K3XYZ DE W3ABC SK (end of contact)

Description of event:

This 1½-hour event is not a contest.

Rather, it is a celebration of our area newcomers new to CW, returners to the mode of CW, and listeners. Also, it is an invitation to our veteran CW operators to enjoy helping the newcomers in making live, on-air CW contacts. There are no points scored, and no results or standings posted.
